- Np. = Neopythagoreans.

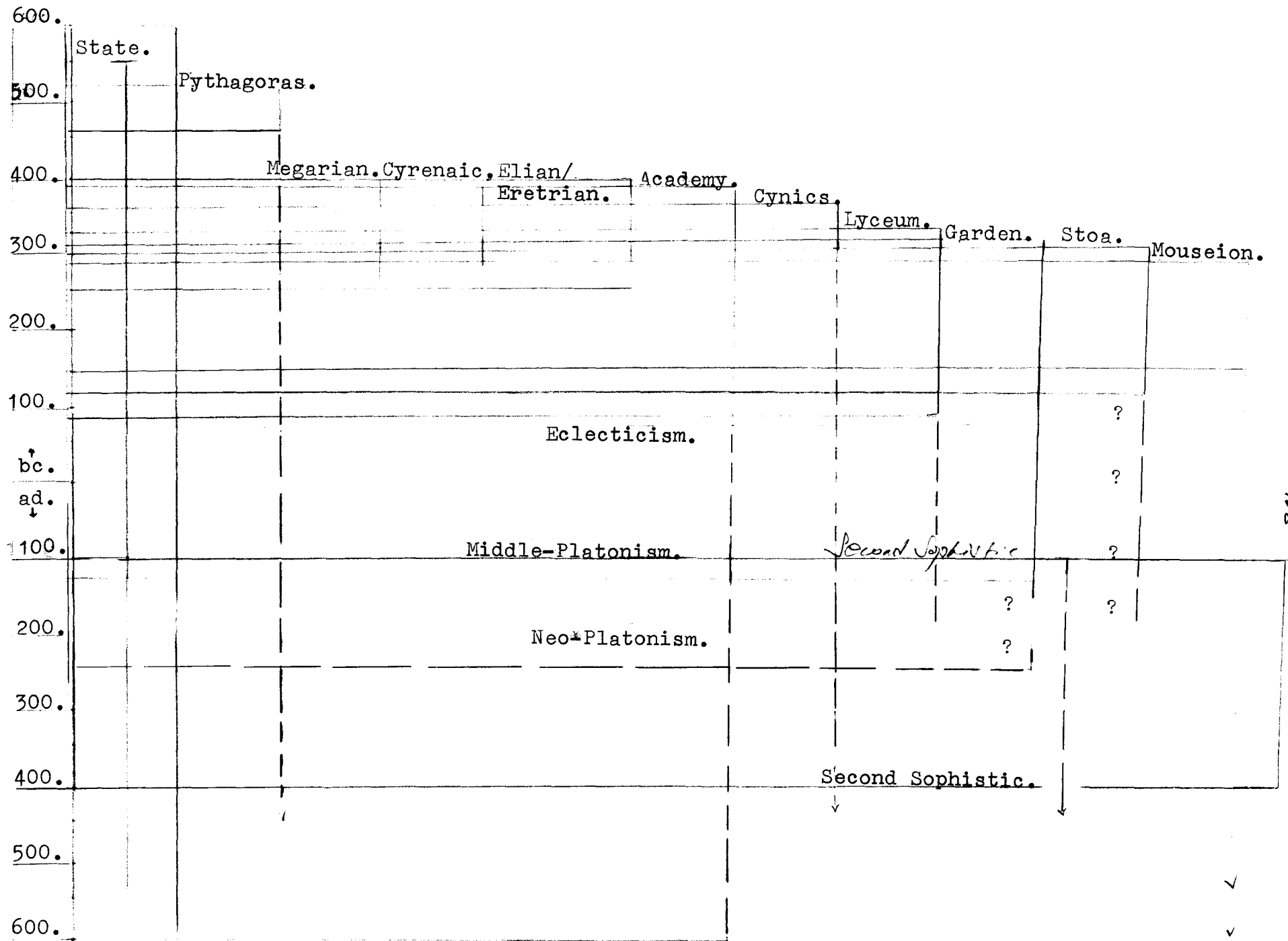
