Forms of Power	Visible Power	Efficacy, Public sentiment, Durability, Maintenance, Safety, Implementation (timeframe, funding)	Refers to the formal institutional structures and technical execution of the Leyte Tide Embankment, focusing on official project mandates, funding streams, and the efficacy and durability of the physical infrastructure.
	Hidden Power	Land control, Resource extraction; Environmental impact, Legal and land rights, Displacement	Concerns the dynamics of exclusion where specific agendas – such as land control, resource extraction, and community displacement – are managed behind formal processes, often benefiting elite interests through "disaster capitalism."
	Invisible Power	Foreign Expertise, Dependency, Safety, Vulnerability, Preparedness	Encompasses the internalized narratives and dependency created by the prioritization of foreign expertise over local wisdom, which shapes community perceptions of their own safety, vulnerability, and capacity for preparedness.
Spaces of Participation	Closed Spaces	Barriers, Misinformation, Transparency	Represents arenas where project decisions are made without public oversight, characterized by barriers to participation such as misinformation, a lack of transparency, and restricted access to environmental impact data.
	Invited Spaces	Consultation, Proximity, Information dissemination, Role of NGOs	Relates to formal, authority-led consultation processes and information dissemination efforts, including the involvement of NGOs and the logistical influence of a community's proximity to meeting sites.
	Claimed Spaces	Citizen control; Local knowledge; Nature-based solutions, Cost-effectiveness	Covers community-led actions and the assertion of citizen control, where local knowledge and organic resistance are used to promote alternative, cost-effective nature-based solutions.
Levels of Power	Local Level	Public sentiment, Local knowledge, Proximity	Focuses on power dynamics at the immediate community or barangay scale, including neighborhood-level engagement, local leadership, and the localized lived experiences of public sentiment.
	National Level	Strategies and policies for recovery; National implementation of LTE	Pertains to the influence of national government policies, strategic recovery frameworks, and the institutional mandates of agencies like the DPWH that guide the project's governance.
	Global Level	Foreign expertise, Dependency, Resource extraction	Addresses the impact of international donor standards, global expertise models, and the external influence of transnational recovery agendas on the project's overall direction.
